

# HOW TO TAKE CARE OF MIPTORS

Miptors are in the reptile family they are not lizards even though they look like them. You can tell the difference as they have horn like lumps on their head. Their home is the Antarctic. Miptors are unusual pets, they have sharp pointy claws they also have red and green spots with a crown on it's head.

## HOUSING A MIPTOR

Housing a Miptor is an important job since Miptors live in the Antarctic they are used to cold temperatures. Because of this you would have to purchase a mini air vent and set it to -25°C. You may want to buy some sturdy and smooth rocks so they feel more at home. Also maybe a little thing for them to climb up.

## FEEDING A MIPTOR

Feeding a Miptor is as important as housing one. You should already have bowl and snow cave also fish and a water feeder. The fish should not be tinned fish it should be salmon, cod or tuna pieces. If the Miptor doesn't eat the food within 2 days then you should remove the food from the vivarium or your Miptor could get ill.

## HANDLING A MIPTOR

When handling a Miptor you need to be careful or the Miptor will get vicious. Children under 10 should be supervised by an adult. When you are picking a Miptor up you should hold it by the shoulders and lift it up do not lift it up too fast or hold it too hard because if you do it's shoulders could snap then it wouldn't be able to walk for 9 months
