

LO: To apply my place value knowledge.



Have a go at answering the following questions.

If you want to challenge yourself today why not try and explain your answer by using your place value knowledge. By explaining your answers it allows you to gain and show a greater knowledge of place value. For example:

Question: Which number is bigger 22 or 27? How do you know?

Answer: 27 is the bigger number. I know this because they both have 2 in the tens place value column but 27 has a number 7 in the ones place value column whereas 22 has a 2 in the ones place value column. 7 is bigger than 2 so 27 is the biggest number.

1. John picked 12 flowers for his mum, and Sarah picked 17 for her mum. Who picked the most?
2. Zoo A has 9 pandas. Zoo B has 11 pandas. Which zoo has the most pandas?
3. Adam ate 21 grapes. Sindhu ate 23. Did Sindhu eat more or less grapes than Adam?
4. Zoe baked 14 cupcakes and Darcie baked 19. Who baked more? How do you know which number is more?
5. In a competition to find the most Easter eggs, Isaac found 23 and Aziz found 31. Who won the competition?

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6. Jayden counted 41 bees in the school garden, and 14 ladybirds. Did he spot more ladybirds or bees?
7. Peter scored 34 points in the game, Sean scored 41 and Emma scored 29. Who scored the most? Who scored the least?
8. Class 1 has 31 children. Class 2 has 28 children. Class 3 has 33 children. Which class has the most children? Does Class 2 have more or less children than Class 1?
9. Ashton spent 63p at the shop. Wei Wei spent 58p and Rebecca spent 72p. Who spent the most money? Who spent the least money?
10. The farmer kept 97 sheep and 88 cows in a field. Were there more sheep or cows?
11. Abi has 75 orange beads, 83 blue beads and 91 purple beads to make a necklace with. Which colour did she have least of?
12. The grocers shop ordered 81 oranges, 97 bananas, 100 apples and 89 melons. Which fruit did they order the most of? How do you know which number is more?
