The Ugly Five – Julia Donaldson

Monday	<p>LO: To be able to identify rhyming words.</p> <p>Watch the video on the class page of the website.</p> <p>Using the page of the book on the website can you circle/ highlight and identify each of the rhyming couplets.</p> <p>Once your child has done this, can they then think of another word that rhymes with each rhyming couplet.</p>
Tuesday	<p>LO: To be able to research the meaning of new vocabulary.</p> <p>Rewatch the video story from yesterday's lesson. In the story there are a few new words that your child may be unsure of so I would like your child to research and find out the meanings of these words. Can these then either be written on the sheet provided on the website or alternatively they can be written in their writing books.</p> <p>The words to research are:</p> <p>dawned, spindly, ambled, trampling, ungainly, appalled</p>
Wednesday	<p>LO: To be able to use adjectives to describe one of 'The Ugly Five'.</p> <p>Watch the video on the class page of the website.</p> <p>Ask you child to choose one of remaining 'Ugly Five' to describe using adjectives and then write sentences.</p>
Thursday	<p>LO: To research about an African animal.</p> <p>Ask you child to choose an animal they think should be included in 'The Ugly Five' story as we are going to be writing an additional part to the story to make 'The Ugly Six'.</p> <p>Research the animal to find out facts about the animal and make notes ready to use tomorrow.</p>
Friday	<p>LO: To write the sixth animal to add to the 'The Ugly Five' story.</p> <p>Watch the video on the class page of the website.</p> <p>Using the information your child found out last lesson I would like them to write their own part for the sixth animal for the story. Remembering that this is a fiction book with some elements of fact I would like your child to have a go writing similar to the story. They do not need to use rhyming words however if they wish to challenge themselves they can see if they can include some rhyming words.</p>
